- McGill University, Michelle Blade
 - Introduction on research project partnered with Aqqiumavvik Society.
 - Says they are conducting research on permafrost and underground creeks at two locations near Arviat, Itiguarjuk and Wolf Esker, during the winter of 2025/2026 as southern scientists' information does not correlate to the reality of the information that scientists in the north have.
 - Says the research pairs with Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit with permafrost and groundwater science to identify and assess locally relevant landscape indicators of winter groundwater movement along overland travel routes.
 - Says they will be installing trail cameras to take daily photos of the overflow water and resulting ice formations.
 - Says they will be installing small sensors to check on the water temperatures, electrical conductivity and water levels, daily.


